



Michigan Shell Jobbers Scholarship Program

THE PROGRAM

The Michigan Shell Jobbers' Education Foundation has established a scholarship program to assist employees and employees' children of Michigan Shell Jobbers and their affiliated dealers who plan to pursue postsecondary education in college or vocational school programs. Scholarships are offered each year for study at an accredited institution of the student's choice.

This scholarship program is administered by Scholarship Management Services®, a division of Scholarship America®. Scholarship Management Services is the nation's largest designer and manager of scholarship and tuition reimbursement programs for corporations, foundations, associations and individuals. Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, age, gender, disability or national origin.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the Michigan Shell Jobbers Scholarship Program must be -

- Part-time or full-time employees or dependent* children of part-time or full-time employees who have a minimum of one year employment with Michigan Shell Jobbers. Employees and the dependent children of affiliate Dealers of Michigan Shell Jobbers are also eligible and subject to the same eligibility requirement of Jobber employees.

** Dependents are defined as persons who qualify as federal tax exemptions to the employee.*

- Part-time and full-time employee applicants must be students who are enrolled or planning to enroll in part-time or full-time study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school for the entire upcoming academic year.
 - Dependent applicants must be students who are enrolled or planning to enroll in full-time study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or vocational technical school for the entire upcoming academic year.

AWARDS

Michigan Shell Jobbers' Education Foundation will award three \$2,000 scholarship awards.

Walters-Dimmick Petroleum, Inc. will sponsor an additional \$2,000 award for an applicant representing their company.

Awards are not renewable, but students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

Awards are for undergraduate study only.

APPLICATION

Interested students must complete the application and mail it along with a current, complete transcript of grades to Scholarship Management Services postmarked no later than **January 31**. Grade reports are not acceptable. Online transcripts must display student name, school name, grade and credit hours earned for each course, and term in which each course was taken.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. Applications are evaluated on the information supplied; therefore, answer all questions as completely as possible. All information received is considered confidential and is reviewed only by Scholarship Management Services.

SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal.

Selection of recipients is made by Scholarship Management Services. In no instance does any officer or employee of The Michigan Shell Jobbers' Education Foundation play a part in the selection. All applicants agree to accept the decision as final.

Applicants will be notified in April. Not all applicants to the program will be selected as recipients. Students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship Management Services processes Michigan Shell Jobbers Scholarship Program scholarship payments on behalf of The Michigan Shell Jobbers' Education Foundation and Walters-Dimmick Petroleum, Inc. Payments are made in equal installments on August 15 and December 30. Checks are mailed to each recipient's home address and are made payable to the school for the student.

OBLIGATIONS

Recipients have no obligation to The Michigan Shell Jobbers' Education Foundation or Walters-Dimmick Petroleum, Inc. They are, however, required to notify Scholarship Management Services of any changes of address, school enrollment or other relevant information and to send a complete transcript when requested.

REVISIONS

The Michigan Shell Jobbers' Education Foundation reserves the right to review the conditions and procedures of this scholarship program and to make changes at any time including termination of the program.
